Herem - to ______ from human use

"... removing an identity from use depends on what identity is used for. We suggest that the action is comparable to what we might try to accomplish by disbanding an organization. Doing so does not entail typically of disposing all the members, but it means that nobody is able to say, 'I am a member of X' anymore. After World War II. when the Allies destroyed the Third Reich, they did not kill every individual German soldier or citizen they killed the leaders specifically and deliberately (compare to the litany of kings put to the sword in Joshua 10 - 13) and also burned the flags, toppled the monuments, dismantled the government and chain of command, disarmed the military, occupied the cities, banned the symbols, vilified the ideology, and persecuted any attempt to resurrect it-- but most of the people were left alone.....This is what it means to herem an identity."
