

The Heart of the Story

Leviticus 4:5-7(NIV): Then the anointed priest shall take some of the bull's blood and carry it into the tent of meeting. <sup>6</sup> He is to dip his finger into the blood and sprinkle some of it seven times before the LORD, in front of the curtain of the sanctuary. <sup>7</sup> The priest shall then put some of the blood on the horns of the altar of fragrant incense that is before the LORD in the tent of meeting. The rest of the bull's blood he shall pour out at the base of the altar of burnt offering at the entrance to the tent of meeting.

Hebrews 9:12-14(NIV): He did not enter by means of the blood of goats and calves; but he entered the Most Holy Place once for all by his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption. <sup>13</sup> The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer sprinkled on those who are ceremonially unclean sanctify them so that they are outwardly clean. <sup>14</sup> How much more, then, will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from acts that lead to death, so that we may serve the living God!

Leviticus 17:11(NLT): ...for the **life of the body is in its blood**. I have given you the blood on the altar to purify you, making you right with the LORD. It is the blood, given in **exchange** for a life, that makes **purification possible**."
