Discussion Questions

- 1. Read Romans 3:1-8. What are some things that Paul is trying to correct and reinforce in these verses?
- 2. How do these verses help clarify your understanding of the Christian life?
- 3. How do you know when someone is faithful? What does faithfulness look like?
- 4. Paul uses the rhetorical argument that our unrighteousness brings out or highlights God's righteousness. And, our unfaithfulness highlights God's faithfulness. Is there truth to this? Why or why not?
- 5. From Sunday's message, what was most impactful to your understanding of God?
- 6. Part of God's faithfulness, as you respond to him, is his promise to transform your character into the image of Jesus. How does this demonstrate God's faithfulness? (Cf. 1 Thessalonians 5:23-24)

- 7. Read 1 Corinthians 1:4-9. What are some of the promises that God makes to his followers in these verses? Of these, which one resonates most and why?
- 8. Can you think of periods of your life where you felt that God had washed his hands of you and gave up on you? Why did it feel that way?
- 9. Where have you seen God's faithfulness in your life? Those moments, where looking back, you can say, "God was there helping or working in the background."
- 10. God's faithfulness is expressed in his continued work within us to bring about the image of Jesus. If you could have one aspect of your life or character instantly changed to look more like Jesus, what would it be?
- 11. John talked about our response to God's faithfulness. What does your response look like in regard to Sunday's message and these verses?
