## INTRODUCTION

## 2/4/2018

The name *Elohim* is used through the creation narrative in Genesis 1-2. Being creator, God (*Elohim*) is known as personal, powerful and purposeful. To understand this name more fully we need to focus more on knowing God personally than on our own power or purpose.

## QUESTIONS

- 1. What is one thing you took away from Sunday's message?
- 2. How does God as creator impact your understanding of who he is? How might this impact your daily life?
- 3. Of the three characteristics—personal, powerful or purposeful—that John mentioned, which one most intrigues or resonates with you? Why?
- How is God personal? How is he personal in being both near us (at hand) and also sovereign over all things (far away)? (Jeremiah 23:23-24)
- 5. Jeremiah states that God fills, or occupies, both heaven and earth. What does this communicate about his power?
- 6. As creator, he stands above and among his creation. Genesis 18:14 asks, "Is anything too hard for the Lord?" Does this understanding of God currently come to mind in the midst of challenge? Why do you feel that is?

- 7. What comes to mind when you think of God being powerful?
- 8. Does the image of a powerful creator instill trust or fear?

If you mentioned fear, what would help move the needle a little closer to the trust side?

- 9. John mentioned that knowing God as a creator, who is personal, powerful and purposeful allows us to trust and rest in him. What does he mean by this?
- 10. How does our view of God as *Elohim* shape our ability to rest in him?
- 11. In what way(s) will you respond to Sunday's message?
