Isaiah 58:1,2, 4-10: "Declare to my people their <u>rebellion</u> and to the descendants of Jacob their sins.

- **2** For day after day they seek me out; they seem eager to know my ways, as if they were a nation that does what is right and has not forsaken the commands of its God.
- **4** Your <u>fasting</u> ends in quarreling and strife, and in striking each other with wicked fists. You cannot fast as you do today and expect your voice to be heard on high.
- **5** Is this the kind of fast I have chosen, only a day for people to <a href="https://humble.com/humble">humble</a> themselves? Is it only for bowing one's head like a reed and for lying in sackcloth and ashes? Is that what you call a fast, a day acceptable to the Lord?
- **6** "Is not this the kind of fasting I have chosen: to <u>loose the chains of injustice</u> and untie the cords of the yoke, to set the <u>oppressed free</u> and <u>break every yoke</u>? **7** Is it not to share your food with the hungry and to provide the poor wanderer
- with shelter—
  when you see the naked, to clothe them, and not to turn away from your own
  flesh and blood?
- **8** Then your <u>light</u> will break forth like the dawn, and your <u>healing</u> will quickly appear; then your <u>righteousness</u> will go before you, and the <u>glory</u> of the Lord will be your rear quard.
- **9** Then you will call, and the Lord will answer; you will cry for help, and he will say: Here am I. If you do away with the yoke of oppression, with the pointing finger and malicious talk,
- **10** and if you spend yourselves in behalf of the hungry and satisfy the needs of the oppressed, then your light will rise in the darkness, and your night will become like the noonday."
